While excavating a well on the farm of August Gaffke, near the Pipestem river, just west of Jamestown, what are believed to be the bones of some prehistoric animal were unearthed. The bones consisted of the hip bone and several smaller ones in a good state of preservation, and a tooth which is 31 inches long and 2 inches wide. The smooth portion where the roots were buried in the jaw show that the tooth penetrated the jaw about an inch. The tooth consists of three cusps attached to one root, and is in a fine state of presevation. The bones will be saved and an effort made to identify the monster to which they belonged.
