## SIGURD BERG

DEATH OF AGED RESIDENT OC-CURRED THURSDAY OF LAST

WEEK. INTERMENT HELD AT OLD HOME IN MINNESOTA.

Sigurd Berg, at the age of 91 years and nearly three months, died at the home of his son, Rollef, Thursday of last week, the cause of his death being of old

age. Though he had been fairly good health in his declining years his strength gradually gave way and death was not an unwelcome visitor. Sigurd Berg was born in Telle-

markten, Norway, January 24,

1820. Married in 1841, he immi-

grated to this country in the year 1856 and lived in Boone county, Illinois, for about three years. Becoming imbued with the prevailing spirit of moving westwards he and his family became settled in Filmore county. Minnesota, where he followed the occupation of a farmer for a number of years until the death of his faithful wife who passed to the great beyond in the year 1874.
