

KILLED UNDER SWITCH ENGINE

CARL R. BRAND VICTIM OF ACCIDENT ON FIFTH AVENUE CROSSING.

Jamestown, Nov. 6.—Carl R. Brand, one of the oldest residents of Jamestown, was killed on the N. P. crossing at Fifth avenue Thursday evening at about 8 o'clock, being caught under a switch engine as he was proceeding to the opera house to hear Gov. Burke's address. The old man, 87 years of age, was walking across the tracks, when the switch engine, moving west, with two coaches, taken from the Valley train, struck Brand, dragging him with the train across Fifth avenue and down in front of the N. P. headquarters, where the engine was stopped. Brand was almost ground to pieces, the body dismembered and terribly mutilated, almost beyond recognition. Pieces of the remains were ground along the track, and some time was spent in gathering them together. It was not until later that identification could be made; a card addressed to Carl R. Brand finally giving the clew.
