

# FARMER BRUTALLY MURDERED

AGED MAN SHOT DEAD. GANG  
FROM MARMARTH WENT OUT  
PREPARED FOR TROUBLE.

Bowman, N. D., Sept. 24.—  
Messengers have just arrived,  
bringing the news of the murder  
of Del Crowe, four miles from  
Concord in this county and thirty  
miles southwest of Bowman.

The crime is said to have been  
committed by Denver Woods of  
Marmarth who, with Lafe Woods,  
Fred Hickey, Hank Miller and  
Kelly, went to C. A. Lowe's to  
take a horse which Lafe Woods  
claimed.

Lafe Woods was in the barn  
getting the horse when Lowe ar-  
rived and closed the door.

Crowe, the father-in-law of  
Lowe, was going toward the  
barn. As he passed Denver  
Woods, Mrs. Lowe called to tell  
the man that Woods was pulling  
a gun. Crowe turned in time to  
be shot in the breast.

The bunch took the horse and  
remained on a hill near there un-  
til 9 o'clock. The people were  
afraid of being held up if they  
started for town until under cov-  
er of darkness. T. R. Green and  
Frank Taylor started for Bow-  
man. Sheriff Moore left imme-  
diately for the scene of the mur-  
der.
