EXPIRED IN BUGGY

GEORGE DEVOLVE SUDDENLY
PASSED AWAY WHILE SITTING
IN VEHICLE.

—After living 87 years without a days illness until the last few weeks, George Devolve, one of the oldest residents of Jamestown passed away while riding in a buggy Thursday morning at 4 o'clock in the eastern part of the city. Death was due to heart failure.

The deceased was sitting in the back seat of a buggy at the time together with his son. John Devolve, daughter-in-law and grand daughter. Mrs. Devolve and the baby were sitting at his side. She noticed that the old man gasped a little and settled down in the seat, and looking closer found that the old man had passed away without a struggle.

Their physician, Dr. Guest, was immediately called and the county coroner pronounced the death caused by chronic heart trouble brought by a valvular lesion of the heart. The remains were were brought to Flint's undertaking establishment.

At the time of the death the family were removing from their home, 115 Milton avenue south to a farm near Spiritwood rented from the Uanuawicks, the Servian who left for California this a cek. The old man intended to live with his son and family on the farm. He was quite well known around town having worked at odd jobs in this city until last year notwithstanding his advanced age. He could be seen on the streets at 6 p. m. every morning until quite recently. Deceased came to Jamestown from Wisconsin. Another son Wm. Devolve, survives in the city, at 1032 West Second street. George Devolve was born in

February, 1829. He was a widower and is survived by eight children. He was a farmer by occupation. The funeral will be held Saturday from Flint's undertaking rooms with interment at Jamestown cemetary, Rev. Phillips officiating.
