

# WANDERED AWAY TO HIS DEATH

PARENTS OF HARRY DUNLAP  
COME TO NORTH DAKOTA TO  
PUSH INVESTIGATION.

Williston, N. D., April 2nd. —  
On the arrival today of his par-  
ents from Spring Valley, Ia.,  
Williams county officials began  
an investigation into the cause  
of the death of Harry Dunlap,  
whose body was found lying on  
the prairie near Twelve-mile hill  
where it had evidently been  
since early in the winter.

On Nov. 8 last Dunlap was ar-  
rested in Williston for an assault  
upon Earl Alleman. After be-  
ing held in jail for a short time  
he was found to be suffering  
from delirium tremens and was  
removed to a hospital. Two  
days later he left with the in-  
tention of going only a short dis-  
tance, but that was the last seen  
of him.

Officials were notified and a  
search started. Traces of him  
were discovered near Twelve-  
mile hill, where he had broken  
into two shacks in quest of food.  
He had also been to the home of  
a friend named Haas in that dis-  
trict, remaining there several  
hours.

Mr. and Mrs. William Dunlap,  
the father and mother, desire to  
take the body back to Iowa for  
burial.
