

## OBITUARY OF WILLIAM GALLIVAN

DIED AT HIS HOME ON DECEMBER  
13TH FROM HEART FAILURE.

The following communication was received from Mrs. Griffith of Alberta anent the death and interment of the late William Gallivan who passed away at his home at Massinasin, Alta., from what is supposed to have been an attack of heart disease brought about by a partly cured goitre for which the deceased underwent an operation at a Rochester, Minn. hospital several years ago which never was wholly cured because the deceased refused to submit to a second operation.

William Gallivan was born in Sharpville, Penn., in the year 1859 and died at his home in Massinasin, Alberta, Dec. 9, 1910, aged 51 years. A portion of his life was spent in the states of Ohio and North Dakota.

He was married to Elizabeth Tucker in Jamestown, N. D. 25 years ago next March. There remain to mourn his death, the beloved wife, two daughters; Mrs. A. O. Lohrke of Courtenay and Miss Hazel and son Harold, of Massinasin, Alta., also his mother, four sisters and two brothers residing in the state of Pennsylvania.

The funeral services were held at the home of the deceased Tuesday afternoon Dec. 13, at 2 o'clock, conducted by Rev. R. W. Griffith.

The world is poorer for the loss of William Gallivan who was taken from us seemingly all too soon. A man clean in body, mind and soul; his kindness won him friends wherever he went and his goodness made him a man of power. As the sun reveals its most magnificent splendor at sunset, so in the life of our departed brother, his last days revealed the beauty, the grandeur and the nobility of his character.
