It becomes our sad duty to chronicle in this issue the deaths of two of our old and respected citizens and old time settlers of this county. Friday morning a telegram arrived reporting the demise of James Keiran who was living on a claim near Taber, Alberta. He had been ailing for only a week from Bright's disease but no apprehension was felt regarding the eventual fa tality of his illness. The news of his unexpected death came therefore as a sudden shock to his family, who reside a few miles north of here, and to his friends. His body was brought to Wimbledon Monday morning

and taken for burial to the Catholic cemetery. Funeral services were held from the Catholic church of which the deceased was a member.

James Keiran was born in 1857 and was at the time of his death a little over 53 years of age.
