d Mrs. John Albrecht met with e an accident the early part of last ŀ week which might have had serig ous after results. While coming down the big hill leading to the valley east of Blue lake the neckr yoke of the rig in which she was a riding became loosened, permit-V ting the buggy to run onto the V horses. In turning the horses to r S one side the buggy was drawn t into several deep ruts, the jolt of the rig throwing Mrs. Albrecht C t between the horses. It was fortunate that she received no serit ł ous injury from the fall which easily might have proved fatal. 8 The remarkable part of the acci-S dent was that the team circled i around until they returned to where Mrs. Albrecht lay and there stopped, allowing her to get in the buggy and proceed on her way. She became so weak though from the shock that she was compelled to stop at the farm of Ed. Lange, who took her to her home. Though it was thought at first that she received internal injuries which might prove to be of serious nature, from last reports obtained she has entirely recovered.
