

BOUND OVER ON MURDER CHARGE

MAN WHO SHOT CHEF AT VALLEY CITY HOTEL MUST FACE THE MUSIC.

Valley City, N. D., July 30.—Olaf H. Anderson, the clerk at the Hotel Windsor, who shot and killed Robert Seeford, the chef at the same hotel a short time since, was given his preliminary hearing before Judge Moe. M. J. Englert appeared for the accused and A. P. Paulson and D. R. Ritchie for the state. After the hearing Judge Moe bound the defendant over to the district court without bail and he was committed to jail.

It appeared from the testimony that the men engaged in a quarrel over the night clerk calling the chef at a certain hour and that the chef threatened him, but the testimony of a dishwasher, Harry Gillhurt, showed that he was armed with nothing worse than a couple of potatoes.

The defendant testified that he was threatened with a knife but the deposition of the murdered man before he died and the testimony of the dishwasher, who witnessed the quarrel, but did not see the shooting, tended to show that Seeford was not armed.
