BABY BOY OF MR. AND MRS. H. N. LUNDE SUMMONED BY DEATH AFTER BRIEF ILLNESS.

The grim reaper of death entered the home of one of our citizens and friends and snuffed out the life of an innocent babe without regard to the excruciating suffering of the devoted parents. On the same day that our honored and respected friend and citizen, C. A. Miss Mae McBride came up from Wimbledon to play for the dance last Friday evening and was the guest at the Brewer home while here.

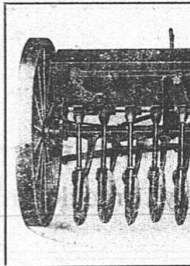
