

SHERIFF WANTS TO FIND MILL AGENT

WARD COUNTY MAN IS CHARGED
WITH TAKING COMPANY'S
FUNDS.

Minot, N. D., May 15.—J. Z. Dunwoodie of Columbus, this county, is missing, and a warrant for his arrest on a charge of embezzlement and forgery is in the hands of Sheriff Sorenson. Dunwoodie has left the country. His total shortage with his employers, the Standard Grain company, who operate a mill at Columbus, is said to be \$1,100, according to charges filed. Some of this was in cash, taken in at the mill, but the greater amount he is alleged to have secured on the company's checks.

Dunwoodie came to the Standard Grain company only about six weeks ago, and was highly recommended. He came from a small town in southwestern Missouri, somewhere near Nevada, and brought his wife with him. During the short time he was at Columbus he made many friends and rapidly gained the confidence of the business people. As he was in sole charge of the business of the company, Dunwoodie had unlimited credit in the town. He was to have been bonded and the agent of the bonding company came to the town a short time ago, but for some reason or other he left without perfecting the bond. Dunwoodie had been authorized to write checks, and he had no trouble in getting them cashed. Dunwoodie told his wife nothing when he left. She is a young woman and the couple had no children.
