LOUIS LAMOTT GETS SENTENCED
TO PENITENTIARY FOR
BURGLARY.

PLEADED GUILTY

TO BREAKING INTO THE HOUSE OF
A. G. GREGORY AND PURLOIN-
ING WATCH.

Sheriff Nels Romer, accompanied by Geo. W. Thorp and John W. Carr, arrived from Jamestown Monday, having in their custody Louis Lamott who was arrested two weeks ago today on the charge of unlawfully entering the farm home of A. G. Gregory while he and his family were absent and purloining a lady's watch and chain. The charge preferred against him was burglary, he having effected an entrance by means of a skeleton key. He was brought before Judge Coffey and was sentenced to serve one year in the penitentiary. Pleading guilty to the charge, no defence was made on the part of the prisoner and for this reason the sentence was light, the charge of burglary being a serious one. He was taken to Bismarck Tuesday, his term of sentence beginning on that day.
