

The large barn standing on the property owned by W. C. Hensel north of the track was moved to a new location Tuesday to the place which is now occupied by Mr. Hensel and his family on South Fourth avenue. It is a large building and required considerable power to move it to its present site. Being higher than the telephone wires strung across Fourth avenue some had to be taken down to permit the passage of the moving barn. The wires leading to the Gazette office were also taken down and its force was temporarily cut off from all wire communication. By sunset the wires had been replaced however and the service resumed. The work of moving the barn was done by Grant Partlow of Kensal. The aerial feat of W. Beldin of the Northwestern Telephone company in walking on the top ridge of the barn and lifting some of the wires over the building while it was being moved was commented on by many onlookers of being a hazardous undertaking.
