

Friday afternoon it was noticed that Mrs. Glen Mansfield, who has been staying at the Clark hotel, evidenced peculiar signs of having a slight attack of smallpox and upon the arrival of a physician this belief was established. Dr. Movius, the new health officer, was called and arrived from Jamestown the same day and placed both Mrs. Mansfield and her husband under quarantine. Fortunately the disease had not spread owing to the fact that the family had not mingled much with people and in consequence it was considered unnecessary to quarantine any other apartments except those occupied by Mr. and Mrs. Mansfield. Under favorable conditions it is expected that the quarantine will be lifted within three or four weeks or possibly sooner. The remaining rooms in the Clark hotel were thoroughly fumigated by the health officer and no fear of contagion exists. Dr. Sansing was attending the case until it was placed under order of Dr. Movius.
