This is generally the season for early fish stories. As we can't boast of any stories of this kind here we will give you a gopher story that is a perfectly true one. C. L. McCumber, of Marstonmoor, was in town Monday with \$12 worth of gopher tails and showed the writer a small tobacco pouch that contained 983 grains of wheat and 22 grains of oats that he had taken from the jaws of one gopher he had killed.
