

Death of Mrs. Ingraham

Mrs. G. W. Ingraham of Jamestown died at her old home in Ontario last week Friday. She had been in poor health for some time and she and Mr. Ingraham went east for the benefit of her health. They visited West Baden and Mrs. Ingraham's old home at Ridgetown, Ontario, and her condition seemed to be so much improved that Mr. Ingraham returned to Jamestown leaving her to rest and improve. The news of her death came as a great shock to her husband who was confident in the belief that she would be able to return home by spring.

Mrs. Ingraham was born in New Brunswick in 1854 and was married there to Captain Ingraham, then a captain on the St. Johns river. They came to Jamestown twenty years ago and have conducted the Capital hotel since that time. The first house burned out in 1893 and since then the present house has been their home. Besides her husband she leaves a son, Barry Ingraham, who is interested with his father in the hotel business, and two sisters and a brother in Ontario. The remains were buried in the family lot at Ridgetown.
