MRS. J. J. NASHOLD DEAD

MRS. J. J. NASHOLD OF JAMES-TOWN DIED VERY SUDDELY TUESDAY NIGHT DURING A PARALYTIC STROKE.

Mrs. J. J. Nashold of Jamestown died very suddenly on Tuesday night about ten o'clock during a paralytic stroke. She and her husband had spent the evening at the home of M. D. Williams northeast of town and when they returned home Mr. Nashold assisted her in removing her wraps and then went to the barn to take care of the horse and when he returned five minutes later he found her in an unconscious condition and she died a short time afterwards. Mrs. Nashold suffered a paralytic stroke about three years ago and had never fully recovered but just lately had been enjoying better health and her sudden death came as a great shock to her many friends.

Deceased leaves, beside her husband to mourn her loss, six children, three sons, Miron and Leslie of Jamestown and Bert of Montana, and three daughters Mrs. C. R. Weber, Mrs. Chester Hodge and Mrs. Earl Reed, all of Jamestown. She has four brothers living, two in Chicago one in Michigan and one in Montana. She was 64 years of age and was born in Squire county, New York, and had been married years. They came to this county in the spring of 1883 from Illinois and engaged in farming north of Jamestown where they resided until a year ago when they moved to the city.
