

James Oxenrider and his nephew, Elliott Oxenrider, returned Friday evening from Lisbon where they were called by the death of James Oxenrider's mother, who had been living at the soldiers' home for some time. The Lisbon Free Press has the following to say regarding her:

Mrs. Altharr Oxenrider, who for the past two years has been an inmate of the soldier's home, passed quietly away at noon on Wednesday, June 7. She had been a sufferer from rheumatism and other troubles for several years and died at the good old age of eighty-two. The deceased was the wife of an old soldier and the mother of nine children seven of whom are now living. The oldest son also enlisted with his father and gave his life in the Civil War. Mrs. Oxenrider has lived in Lisbon for a great many years and the many friends of the family extend their sympathy in this bereavement. The funeral service was held at the Home by Rev. C. H. Esterbrook after which interment was made at Oakwood Cemetary.
