

DEATH OF MOT WATSON

DIED AT THE HOSPITAL AT
BRAINERD, MINNESOTA, MON-
DAY MORNING.

The news that Mot Watson had died in the Brainerd hospital at 1:05 Monday morning came as a shock to his many friends in this vicinity. Four weeks ago he was taken to the hospital to receive treatment for typhoid fever but nobody thought his condition serious and it was thought that he would recover in a short time. But in spite of all that medical skill could do he continued to grow worse until the end was reached as above stated. His wife, parents and sister were with him when the end came.

The deceased was the oldest son of Mr. and Mrs. J. M. Watson of Kensal and had been residing at Jamestown where he was employed on the N. P. as brakeman. He was born at Pittsfield, Pa., on June 12, 1879, being 24 years of age. Three years ago he was married to Marie Brastrup of Jamestown and besides his wife and a host of friends he leaves his parents, a brother and sister and other relatives to mourn his untimely death.

The funeral was held from the M. E. church at Kensal on Wednesday afternoon, Rev. Gary officiating. The remains were interred in the Kensal cemetery where they were followed by a large number of friends.
