She came here with her two brothers, Andrew and Peter, and has kept house for them all of the time. Besides these two brothers she leaves two sisters, Mrs. George Wright, who resides here. and Mrs. Cook who resides in Michigan, and another brother, J. H. Whitbeck, who resides at Mount Hope, Kansas, to mourn her sudden demise. They are all highly respected people and Miss Whitbeck made a friend of everyone with whom she became acquainted.

The funeral was held from the Presbyterian church on Tuesday at II o'clock, Rev. Hewson of Wimbledon preaching the sermon. The funeral was largely attended and a large concourse of friends followed the remains to their last resting place in the Court-

enay cemetery.
