## Enforcing the Game Laws.

On complaint of T. E. Warner, J. M. Smith and W. L. Lord, of St Paul, were arrested Thursday morning for violating the game law in regard to shipping game out of the state. It appeared from the evidence that the defendants were shipping prairie chickens out of the state contrary to law-the box, which was seized at the depot, containing about seventy-five birds, instead of a dozen as allowed by law. The case came up for trial before Justice Wm. C. Jimeson, who found the defendants guilty and taking their word that there were only thirteen birds in the box, without counting, fined them \$10 and costs. The case was appealed. The law fixes a fine of \$10 for each bird over a dozen. This is the first case of this kind ever tried in Griggs county, and while it may keep sportsmen from coming here, it will also teach those that do come here that our people do not propose to give them any more rights than the people who live here.
