

A cloud of sorrow overshadowed our little village Wednesday morning, when it was learned that Mrs. Will Stringer had died the preceding evening at 9 o'clock p. m. The deceased had been sick for six weeks and her friends and relatives had hopes that she would recover, but an all seeing providence saw fit to will it otherwise, and she has passed to that bourne from which no traveler returns. She gave birth to a little daughter some six weeks ago, and two weeks after that she was taken with la-grippe and from that Bright's dread disease fastened upon her which finally ended by taking her life.
