Eighteen Hours in a Well.

In trying to ascend the rope became detached and left him struggling in seven feet of ice cold water. By getting the sheep under his feet he was enabled to stand with his head above the water, and in this position he remained all night and part of the next day, when he was rescued, more dead than alive, by his brother eighteen
