M. M. Robinson Died Yesterday at His Residence.

Marcus Milton Robinson died yesterday morning at his home in this city of dropsy, having been ill seven weeks. Mr. Robinson was well known here, having resided in Anaconda for nearly four years, during which time he conducted a general repair shop. He was born in Ballville Sandusky county, Ohio, May 23, 1834, and came to Anaconda from Dakota, where he had resided for a number of years. He was a quiet, unobstrusive man, who had not an enemy in the world, and who was respected by all who knew him. His figure had become a familiar one on our streets and he will be much missed by a large number of friends.

Mr. Robinson leaves a wife, a daughter and two sons. The daughter lives in this city with her mother. One son was in Colorado and the other is in the newspaper business in New Whatcom, Washington. Mrs. Robinson is an invalid and quite deaf, so that the blow is a particularly hard one for her.

The funeral services will be conducted by Rev. William Clyde at the family residence, 313 Locust street, at 2:30 p. m. today. Friends are cordially invited to attend.
