John Hendrickson and Oscar Nordstrom, two young men baching it in a shanty on the edge of Foster county, nearly lost their lives one night last week from asphyxiation by coal gas, and it was only by an accident that they were discovered in time to save their lives. Peter Anderson, a neighbor living near the boys, run out of kerosene and went over to where the boys lived the next afternoon and discovered them almost dead. Mr. Anderson immediatly ran for assistance and a doctor was secured from Courtenay and only after considerable hard work was the lives of the young men saved. They had filled up the stove with coal when they went to bed and shut up all the draughts and the gas escaped. Their dog was also laid out by the gas. It was a narrow escape and to our mind it was providential interference that saved them.
