Sudden Death. The people of Cooperstown were greatly shocked last Monday to hear of the sudden death of Mrs. O. Iverson, which occurred about 7 o'clock Monday evening. The cause of death was apoplexy. About four o'clock Monday morning Mr. Iverson was awakened from his sleep by a cry from his wife, who said she was going to die. She was stricken about this time and immediately lapsed into unconsceousness. Medical aid was summened but the dying woman was beyond all aid in this world and passed quietly away in the evening of the same day. A evening of the same day. blood vessel burst in her brain. The deceased was in the best of health apparently the day before. She was a highly respected lady and her sudden demise is a great shock to her friends and relatives. She leaves in addition to a sorrowing husband, three sons, Ed. Iverson, who lives in St. Paul, and Nels and Alex. of North Dakota, and two daughters, Mrs. Julius Stevens and Mrs. Anton Enger, of Gooperstown. Mrs. Isabella Iverson was born in Norway December 28, 1836, and was 62 years 4 months and 5 days old at the time of her death. She came to the United States with her parents in 1852 and settled near Belvidere, Ill. In 1856 she moved with her parents to Minnesota and came to Cooperstown in 1892. The funeral ceremony was held at the residence of Mr. Iverson Tuesday after-noon, Rev. E. T. Silness, officiaring. The remains were taken to Lanesboro, Minn., for interment Wednesday morning and were accompanied to their last resting place by the sorrowing husband and son, Alex., and the two daughters, Mrs. Stevens and Mrs. Enger.
