Died—at 11:30 a. m., Monday morning, April 24th, 1899, Charles H. Johnson, aged 53 years. One week ago on the day that he died deceased was taken down with pneumonia and for a day or two it was thought that he was improving but the disease had too great a hold on him and he gradually grew worse and passed away as stated above. Judge Johnson was a citizen highly honored and respected, being a favorite with all classes. Four years ago and a few months he was elected county judge of Griggs county and last fall was re-elected for his third term by the largest majority of any candidate on the ticket. He was a conscientious official and always tried to do his duty as he best understood it. The county has lost a valuable and very much appreciated official. Deceased was also an old soldier, having responded to the call to arms during the civil war. He leaves a wife and five children to mourn the loss of a husband and father. The funeral took place at the house Wednesday afternoon at 2 o'clock, Rev. O. D. Purinton preaching the sermon.
