In November, 1892 Mr Wilson married Miss Marta Simonson, and to them was born four children, Floyd seven years, Glen five years, Myra three years and Ralph six months old. He was a member of the Workmen lodge of this place and carried \$2,000 insurance in that order. He also carried \$2,500 insurance in the Union Central Life Insurance company.

The funeral services were held on Wednesday afternoon at the Presbyterian church, the Workman and the Odd Fellow lodges attending in a body. Rev. Cheeseman of Sanborn who is an officer in the Workman lodge here preached the sermon. About fifty carriages followed the remains from the house to the church where nearly as many more met them and followed to the cemetery. More than 250 persons viewed the last remains in the church, thus showing in what high esteem Mr. Wilson was held in this community. Everyone who knew him spoke well of him. Interment took place in the Courtenay cemetery.
