

ACCIDENTALLY SHOT SELF

Iver Anderson, a prominent farmer living about fourteen miles southwest of Hannaford, was instantaneously killed by the discharge of a shotgun Wednesday morning, April 3, 1912. Mr. Anderson was alone at the time, having gone out to get ready to go to town. A few minutes after he left the house a shot was heard but was thought nothing of.

A short time after, however, two hired men coming from the barn saw Mr. Anderson lying near the buggy. In removing from the buggy the gun, which had been used the day before, the trigger had caught and the full charge shot into the body of the unfortunate man. Coroner Almklov was called but found an inquest unnecessary.

Mr. Anderson was about 35 years old, and has long been a resident of Dover township. He was a man well known and liked by all. A father, mother, wife and seven children survive him. Interrment was made in Eidfjord cemetery, Friday, April 5, with Rev. Thoreson officiating.
