Charles H. Russel was killed in a railroad accident in Lowden, Iowa, recently. Mr. Russel will be remembered by a good many Hannaford people as just a year ago he was, employed for a month or more in the Enterprise office. He was a peculiar character in many ways, but when in the mood he was an excellent workman, and possessed an engaging personality. He was a sufferer from "itching feet," as he termed it, meaning thereby his restless disposition which made it impossible for him to remain more than a few weeks in any one place. He had made it a habit to spend the fall months of every year in North Dakota and as a result he was a familiar figure to a large number of the editors of the state.
