Word was received here last week that S. Ben Savre had been killed on Jan. 3. twenty-three miles northeast of Fiagstaff. Arizona, by Mexican cowboys. He was going across country from Flagstaff to another town, a distance of about forty miles, and was apparently overtaken and brutally murdered by cowboys, tho exactly what transpired from the time he left Flagstaff until his body was discovered the following day, is uncertain. Ben Sayre, is the son of R. W. Sayre, of Odebolt, Iowa, and was for a time cashier of his father's bank at that place. Later he had charge of a farm southwest of Hannaford, and, being a hustling energetic young man, made many improvements on the farm. Owing to poor health he was compelled to leave the farm and spent a few weeks in a sanitarium. During the last two years he has been traveling for his health. He was a very engaging, pleasantmannered young man who made a bost of friends during his comparatively brief residence in this community.
