LOST HIS RIGHT ARM.

Stealing a Ride—Fell From the Cars.
Right Arm Crushed.

Ole Hagge, said to be from Costello, S. D., fell from passenger train No. 4 a short distance east of the depot last Thursday evening and had his right arm so badly crushed that it had to be amputated near the shoulder, Dr. Lang, railroad surgeon, performing the oper-

ation, assisted by Dr. Barton.

The unfortunate man was beating his way and was riding between the cars. He says the train started up too quick for him, and he fell. He is supposed to have fallen upon his head as his hat was found next morning partially buried in the sand.

He was heard to call for help shortly after No. 4 left the depot, and when Mr. Whitford went to see what was the matter he met the man coming to the depot.

The victim of the accident was carried to the town hall, where the limb was amputated, and then conveyed to the Sanborn House where he remained until Friday evening when he was taken to the county house at Valley City, where he is said to be recovering from his injuries.
