Death of Mrs. Winterer.

Mrs. Robertha Florence Winterer, wife of Charles Winterer, died at their home in this place last Saturday, Oct. 14th, 1905, at five minutes past 12 m, of paralysis of the nerves, after an illuess of less than a week, aged nearly 26 years.

The Sunday morning before she died she said she would not get up as she did not feel well. She complained that the ends of her fingers felt numb. Her husband looked at them and noticed that they appeared white. A couple of hours later the same sensation appeared at the ends of her toes. She is survived by a husband and infant son, her parents and other relatives, all of whom have the sincere sympathy of our community.

Deceased was born in Liverpool, England, and was brought by her parents to Pembina county, N. D., when ten months old.

Her parents and family reside in Bathgate, N. D., where the body was taken for burial.

Mr. and Mrs. Winterer were married May 23rd, 1900, and have lived in Sanborn three years

Funeral services were held last Sunday afternoon at 3 o'clock in the Congregational church of Sanborn, by the Rev. Mr. Batten of Valley City, and the remains were taken to Bathgate, N. Dak., for interment. Services were held in the Episcopal church of that place, the deceased being a member thereof.

The pall-bearers were Messrs. J. H. O'Shea, H. P. Stroh, C. O. Langer, A. A. J. Lang, C. F. Revell and John Kelling.

Mrs. Steele, mother of Mr. Winterer, who was with her daughter when she died, will take care of the little son.

The removal by death of the young wife and mother is an event to be deplored, and we beg to offer our condolences to the bereaved husband and other relatives.
