

KILLED BY THE CARS.

Leon S. Carl, brother of Mrs. Geo. F. Carl of this place and of Mrs. Scouten, of Eckelson, was run over at Valley City by second 53 about 5 o'clock on the morning of the Fourth.

The deceased came to Sanborn last April. He was a shoemaker by trade and it was his intention to open a shop here. His home was in Towonda, Pa., where he has a wife and two children. He became homesick and with one companion started Monday evening for the east. At Valley City the man with him got drunk and was arrested. Mr. Carl then decided to return to Sanborn and attempted to board a freight train that was running at a high rate of speed, but slipped and went under the cars. He was badly mangled, both legs and an arm being crushed. He lived about an hour and a half and was conscious up to a short time before his death. No one was to blame but himself, according to his own story.

Undertaker Shannon prepared the body for burial and brought it to Sanborn, the funeral taking place from the Congregational church yesterday afternoon at 2 o'clock, Rev. J. N. Haskell conducting the services. The choir sang several familiar and appropriate hymns, and several young men, acquaintances of the deceased, acted as pall bearers.

Though the deceased was not generally known to our people, a large number were present from this place and Eckelson to express their sympathy and respect.
