

DEATH BY DROWNING.

Edwin, the seven year old son of Mr. and Mrs. Sivert Halvorson, was drowned in the river some time Monday morning. The Halvorson home is on the bank of the river about two blocks north of the mill. Mrs. Halvorson missed the boy about 10 o'clock in the morning, but supposed that he had accompanied his father, who was out delivering ice. Mr. Halvorson returned for dinner about 1 o'clock and it was then learned that the boy had not been with him. Search was made and the boy's hat was found floating in the river. The river was dragged and the body was soon found and brought to the surface. Dr. Platou was called in and attempts by means of artificial respiration were made to resuscitate the little fellow, but they were unavailing. He had evidently been in the water for some time. None of Edwin's playmates saw him fall in the river and just how the accident happened will probably never be known. The little fellow was quite venturesome about water and this is said to be the fourth time he has fallen in the river. On the other occasions someone was fortunately at hand to pull him out. The funeral was held Wednesday afternoon from the residence, Rev. Halling officiating.
