Victim Dead

Sunday morning at four o'clock Lydia Prydenberg died from the effect of burns received in the explosion last Wednesday. The remains were brought to Sutton Monday and the funeral held at Mabel Lutheran church, being conducted by Rev. Natwick. The funeral was attended by a vast concourse of people, including friends and neighbors

of the family, and by teachers and pupils of the Sutton school, which she had attended. Burial was by the side of her sister. Agnes, whose funeral was held last Friday.

This sad affair has cast a

gloom over the community and over the school which will take weeks and months to remove. Death is a terrible thing at best but when two young lives are snuffed out almost in a moment it is tragic to the extreme.

Agnes Nina Frydenberg was born June 27, 1902 and Lydia Thea, April 27, 1908, both having spent all of their lives in the Sutton community, with the exception of a few months the former worked at other places. They were popular girls among their young friends, and gave over most of their time to the care of the home since they were quite young.

There are left to mourn their departure, the father, two sisters, Nora, and Mrs. C. M. Jackson; four brothers, Claus, Oscar, Elmer, and Palmer, besides other relatives, neighbors, friends and schoolmates.
