

# Obituary

Christine Sillers was born in Ontario Canada September 27, 1863, and died at her home in Fargo November 25, 1925, her age being 62 years one month and 28 days. When she grew to womanhood she was united in marriage to Robert Bailey, coming to N. Dak. about forty years ago. Together they settled on the homestead two miles east of Sutton, which the family still owns.

Death followed an illness of many years, although she was confined to her bed only a few days.

The remains were brought to the farm home Friday, funeral services being held Sunday afternoon, conducted by Rev. Turtlelotte of Wimbledon. Interment was in Mildred Hartman Memorial cemetery,

The surviving members of the family are her husband, four sons, Edwin, Richard and James of Sutton, and Frank of Glentana Montana; two daughters, Mrs. Violet Taylor of Sutton, and Laura, living at home. There are six grand children, also three brothers and two sisters, living in Canada.

For the past three or four years, since her health became poorer a home was maintained in Fargo, where they spent the winters residing in Sutton during the summers.

Mrs. Bailey was one of North Dakota's pioneers, a quiet home woman, devoted to her family, and greatly loved and respected by all who knew her.
