

Interest in the test well west of Glenfield was greatly increased last week when an artesian basin was tapped at a depth of 3000 feet. Water has been since flowing at the rate of 1000 gallon a minute. It has a salty taste, is lukewarm, and most of the time is clear as crystal. There are varying opinions as to what this may mean, but there's a strong feeling that oil lies below the water basin. Only recently in Montana a well that had been flowing water for three months, went on a rampage and oil forced its way through, running at the last account, 18,000 barrels. Another well, this one in Wyoming, came in after the same fashion, so, naturally, there are strong hopes that this well may eventually do the same thing.
