Friends and relatives of Mrs. J. W. Wilsie were shocked by the news last Thursday that she had died at the hospital in Rochester. She had been operated on a week previous for gall stones and was getting along nicely expecting to be up in a few days, when pneumonia and a weak heart developed.

She had been a sufferer from gall stones for several years and everything had been done that local physicians could do to relieve her without undergoing an operation. It is amazing that she lived and endured the malady as 147 stones were removed at the operation.
