Chester Jackson was seriously injured Saturday while threshing. He was taking care of Frydenberg's separator, and while on the machine slipped and fell, his right arm being caught by the cutter knives in the self feeder. The skin on his forearm was nearly torn off and the flesh was very badly lacerated. Dr. Lewis was called at once, the wounds were dressed and preparations were made to take him to Fargo on No, 2. However, as the train was twelve hours late, they could not start until nine o'clock Sunday morning. His suffering during Saturday night was very great, and the last reports were that his condition had not improved much since reaching the hospital.
