

While driving home from Sutton last Friday night in a two horse buggy, Orson McWethy and K. A. Knutson were crashed into by Adolph Miller and John Peterson, who were in the former's Ford. The impact of the car, which was going about 25 miles per hour, was so great that both occupants of the buggy were thrown out, Knutson landing on his head, sustaining some severe scalp wounds. McWethy fell to the ground behind the horses' feet but escaped injury as the animals broke loose from the buggy when it was struck by the auto. Knutson was brought back to town, and taken to Dr. Lewis' office where his injuries were dressed. Miller had no lights except the small kerosene lamps on the dashboard, so could not see far enough ahead to make fast driving safe.
