Shorty Rides Again H. L. Russell lived over again

for a brief period last Thursday and Friday at the fair, his old jockey days by riding a race horse owned by J. B. Fladeland of Portland, in the racing event each day, being winner the first day, but losing the second. Mr. Russell spent 21 years of his life on the race track and has been astride of famous horses the world over. For a number of years he headed the list in the big stables at Vienna, Austria, one of the owners of which was a brother of Emperor Francis Joseph. He won in some famous events in Europe, some of them being the Derby in Austria, the Queen Elizabeth Prize and the Esterhause Memorial in Hungary. Besides these countries "Shorty" has ridden in Bohemia, France, Bugland, Ireland, Russia, Belgium, he had his leg broken in Brussels] Italy, India, Australia, the Hawaiian Islands, and last but not least our own U. S. A. He quit the big races twelve years ago, although he rode at intervals until 1914.
