

Killed By Fall

The following is taken from the Bismarck Tribune, and the unfortunate man was the father of Evan Monroe, who formerly resided here.

George Munro of this city, and a bridge carpenter in the employ of the Northern Pacific railway company, fell from a scaffold at Flasher, Saturday afternoon and received injuries from which he died.

The direct cause of the accident is not known, though it is stated that he fell about 20 feet, striking his head and shoulders, fracturing his skull. The unfortunate man never regained consciousness. The accident occurred about four o'clock Saturday afternoon and he died about four or five hours later.

Word of the accident was re-

ceived by E. F. Munro of the Munro Electric company and his brother, G. E., cook in the Grand Pacific hotel. The two gentlemen left on the switch engine after supper for Mandan where the Northern Pacific company made up a special train for the purpose of taking the boys to their father and bringing him to the Mandan hospital, but the father died before the boys reached him.

Banker Gentry of Clements-ville, spent Christmas with his family here.
