

Johannes Haugen Passed Away Thursday

After an illness extending over a period of more than a year, most of which time he had been confined to his bed, Johannes Haugen passed away at his farm home three miles east of Walum, Thursday noon, at the age of 75 years and 6 months.

Mr. Haugen, who with his family came to North Dakota from Norway in 1893, was one of the old timers in Greenfield township. Immigrating here from Stamnes near Bergen, Norway, too late to take advantage of the free homesteads, he bought a piece of land where, with hard work, careful management and thrift, he built for himself and family a fine farm home, where he resided until his death.

Deceased is survived by three sons and two daughters; Iver, who resides on the home farm; Johnny, of his village; Bertin, of Medina, N. D.; Mrs. Jacob Watne and Mrs. Hans Romme, of Dazey; also a large number of grand children. He is also survived by two brothers, John and Hans, of Hannaford; and by two sisters, Mrs. J. Kalvik, of Hannaford, and Mrs. Andrew Ole, of Arlow, N. D., besides a large number of other relatives and friends.

Mr. Haugen had been a widower since 1917.

By his quiet manners and true Christian living, Mr. Haugen had won the friendship and respect of all who learned to know him, and the sympathy of the entire community was to the family in their bereavement.
