

Word was received here yesterday that A. W. Johnson had died at Grace City Sunday evening, the cause being a stroke of paralysis. An effort has been made to locate relatives of the deceased, but although Mr Johnson was well known to many persons in all the villages on the branch and the neighboring towns on the Great Northern, no one seemed to know anything more about him than that he was single, apparently very seldom was employed, always had sufficient money to pay for his modest requirements, and from his talk apparently was acquainted with everybody. He used to make frequent visits to the printing offices where he very thoroughly studied the exchanges. He often mentioned places in Norman county, Minn., in his conversation, from which it is assumed that he came from somewhere in that county before locating here. He was a tall, spare man, perhaps over fifty years of age, had peculiarly shifty eyes, and greatly loved to chat and gossip with anyone who had time to listen to him.
