marriage, the mother was taken away and her remains were laid to rest in the Union cemetery northeast of Hannaford. Mr. Johnson was of a disposition which won for him many true

e friends. He was jovial yet serious when confronted with affairs. He was always a Lutheran of faith. He was batized and confirmed in the State Church of Sweden and when he came to North Dakota his interest in the

church continued. He was a member of the Lutheran Church of Cooperstown, where he resided for several years after leaving the homestead. Mr. Andrew Olof Johnson died at the St. Luke Hospital at Fargo, Saturday evening, August 6, at 10 o'clock. The cause of his death was kidney trouble, from which he had been troubled for some time, with complications. All that man can do was done for him, but God had called. And "His ways are

ways." Those of the immediate family who are left to mourn the departure of the deceased are his two daughters, Huldah, Mrs. Marius Hernes of Fargo, and Edna, Mrs. Oscar Ouren of Hannaford.

Funeral services were held at the Lutheran Church at Hannaford on 1 h Wiednesday afternoon, August 10th, Rev. George S. Natwick officiating. in Union Interrement was made 1 cemetery. B
