

Well Known Lady Dies at Home in Auburn

Miss Julia B. Johnson died Thanksgiving day at the home of her sister, Mrs. H.H. Lykken, at Auburn after an illness lasting over seven months. She had suffered from internal cancer and gradually grew weaker until the end came. The loving care of relatives made comfortable her last hours and the certain faith in her Savior sustained her spirit through the suffering she was obliged to undergo.

Deceased was born in Waaukesha county, Wisconsin, on February 28th 1864, and grew to womanhood here. She came to North Dakota in 1883 and made her home with her sister, Mrs. Edwin Olson, at Hannaford, until about six years ago when she came to this county and has since resided at the Lykken home. She was a lifelong member of the Lutheran church and gained much consolation from its sacraments.

She is survived by a sister, Mrs. H. H. Lykken, of Auburn, and a brother, B. J. Johnson, of this city.

The funeral occurred Saturday afternoon at 2 o'clock from the Lykken residence, Rev. H. A. Helsem pastor of the Auburn Lutheran church, officiating. Interment was in the Lutheran cemetery at Auburn.
