

OBITUARY

The death of Miss Edith Lulu Rising took place at Karnak the 10th inst., at 11:50 a. m. after a sickness of nearly a year of Bright's disease. Miss Rising was born Sept. 28, 1873, in Oswego, N. Y. When twelve years of age she came with her parents and settled at Fairmont, N. D.

In 1919 deceased came with her brother Howard and sister Jennie to Karnak, with whom she resided up to the time of her death.

Miss Rising united, quite early in life, with the M. E. Church; but transferred her membership a year ago to the Karnak Presbyterian Church.

The subject of this sketch was a faithful, consistent Christian, living in the enjoyment of experimental salvation; her faith in God remaining bright and clear to the last.

Shortly before her death she expressed, to the writer, her appreciation of the kindness of her friends and neighbors in her sickness.

The visits of Rev. and Mrs. S. B. Doty, their singing, prayers and words of Christian hope and comfort, were by her greatly appreciated. Deceased was a faithful worker in the Church and Sunday School.

She has left to mourn her departure, three brothers and one sister; Arthur, of Tenny, Minn.; Ernest, of Jaspport, Iowa; and Howard and Jennie of Karnak, N. D.

The funeral took place from the Church on Monday, following her death, the pastor of the Church officiating. Her remains were laid to rest in the Ladbury cemetery, to await the resurrection of the just.
