Mr. and Mrs. Washburn had left in their car Monday morning to drive into the Mose community where Mr. Washburn wished to look after some insurance matters. Mr. Washburn appeared as well as usual on the trip. Three miles south of Mose, in Bryan township, Mr. Washburn was taken ill. He was hurried

to the nearest farm home, that of Ed S., and physicians were summoned, but Mr. Washburn had breathed his last before help could arrive. Apoplexy was given as the cause of death, which occurred at 11 o'clock.
